

Exploring Northern Arizona

Bearizona (Williams, AZ 33 miles west of Flagstaff)

Visitors drive through more than three miles of Ponderosa Pine Forest viewing North American animals in natural habitats when they visit. There is also a walk-thru portion of the park and a birds of prey show. Hours: 8 am – 6 pm daily. Buses are allowed and a Step-On-Guide can be provided through Bearizona. Group discounts available. Current rate without a discount is \$22/adult, \$11/child ages 4-12 & \$20/Senior ages 62 & older (tax not included).

Arizona Snowbowl Scenic Chairlift ride (11 miles from Flagstaff)

Take in the dramatic scenery of northern Arizona from a bird's eye view by spending your summer afternoon on Arizona Snowbowl's Scenic Chairlift. The three-passenger per chair chairlift shuttles you up the eastern side of the San Francisco Peaks, and drops you off at 11,500 feet in elevation. From here, you can take in the expansive beauty northern Arizona has to offer. Once you reach the top, a **Forest Service interpretive specialist** will greet you and answer any questions regarding the biology, geology and history of the region.

Hours of Operation: 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. daily (The lift ride up and down is 25 minutes).

Cost: \$20/adult ages 8-69. Those ages 7 & under and 70 & older are free.

Dining Available: Breakfast, lunch & dinner is served at the Agassiz Lodge either inside or on the deck.

Museum of Northern Arizona (Flagstaff)

The museum is located two miles from downtown Flagstaff along scenic Highway 180 to Grand Canyon National Park in Flagstaff, Arizona. Our 200 acre campus includes an exhibit building, research labs, and state of the art collections facilities for more than five million Native American artifacts, natural science specimens, and fine art pieces. Founded in 1928, our mission is to inspire a sense of love and responsibility for the beauty and diversity of the Colorado Plateau through collecting, studying, interpreting, and preserving the region's natural and cultural heritage. MNA works in collaboration with native peoples of the Southwest to protect and foster the cultures, traditions, and beliefs of the Colorado Plateau by encouraging artistic expression and supporting, empowering, and educating visitors about the region's art and cultures. The Museum is accredited by the American Alliance of Museums.

Flagstaff Extreme (3 miles south of Flagstaff)

Flagstaff extreme is located in Fort Tuthill County Park on 89A South and provides hours of tree-to-tree adventures for different ages and skill levels.

Adventure Course - \$52/guest+taxes and fees.

Adventure Zip Lines - \$62/guest+taxes and fees.

Kid's Course - \$27/guest+tax and fees – Ages 7-11

Sunset Crater Volcano & Wupatki National Monuments (20 miles from Flagstaff)

Most visitors drive through the 34 mile scenic loop that winds from Highway 89 through Sunset Crater Volcano and Wupatki National Monuments. The scenic loop leads you from the high Ponderosa Pine forests of Sunset Crater, down nearly 2,000 feet in elevation to the red rocks and painted desert vistas of Wupatki.

Pueblos at Wupatki are prehistoric villages that were occupied 900 years ago. Though their remains stand as silent sentinels today, they were once homes that echoed with activity, voices, life, and laughter. In parts of the Southwest, some Native American people continue to live in stone pueblos today.

All trails are **open from sunrise to sunset** to self-guided visitation.

Hours

Sunset Crater Visitor Center: 8 am – 5 pm daily

Wupatki Visitor Center: 9 am – 5 pm daily

2018 Cost: \$20/passenger vehicle and pass is valid for 7 days.

The cost covers both Sunset Crater & Wupatki. Be sure to bring the receipt into the Visitor Center that was not the original point of entry for proof of payment.

Walnut Canyon National Monument (7 miles east of Flagstaff)

From diverse plant and animal life, to the remains of structures dotted across the canyon, Walnut Canyon National Monument offers a look into the past and how people have adapted to the land and their environment to survive and thrive. Take I-40 East to exit 204 and turn south. The Visitor Center is located at the end of this 3 mile road.

Hours: 9am – 5 pm Monday thru Sunday from Memorial Day weekend thru October 31 annually.

Fee: \$8 per visitor 16 years old and older for seven days. Children 15 years old and younger are free.

Hiking Opportunities (near and in Flagstaff)

There are many trails in and around the Flagstaff area with different ranges of difficulty, length and elevations. Grand Canyon Railway Trip – Williams to Grand Canyon (33 miles East of Flagstaff)

Schedule

Depart Williams at 9:30 am arrives at GCNP 11:45 am then Departs GCNP at 3:30 pm arriving in Wms at 5:45 pm.

Also have a 10:30 am departure return at 6:45 pm option

Verde Valley Railroad (Clarkdale, AZ near Sedona, is 67 miles from Flagstaff)

The tracks follow the Verde River north and west of Clarkdale, Arizona to the ghost town of Perkinsville and back. The train follows the same route from Perkinsville back to Clarkdale.

First-class cars accommodate 24 to 40 passengers on plush upholstered furniture. There are 9 first class cars. Full bar service at one's seat is featured and appetizers are complimentary. A Champagne (or sparkling cider) toast is offered upon boarding. Coach car accommodates 80 passengers on traditional two-person seats on each side of a center aisle with snacks for sale. There is one coach car. There are also open-air cars interspersed throughout the train

Train Schedule: All trains depart at 1 pm and takes four hours round trip.

Rates: First class \$89.95/person Adult Coach \$64.95/person – Both rates are subject to applicable taxes & fees. There is a 12% group discount available, provided one person coordinates & pays for event.

The whole train can accommodate 340 people. By purchasing all first class seats in a car at group rate you can charter out the car with just members of your group.

Pink Jeep Tours – Sedona (29 miles South of Flagstaff)

There are 7-8 people per Jeep. Some tours do have a maximum number of people, for example, Broken Arrow has a maximum of 40 people, but other tours can accommodate larger groups. Group rates apply to parties of 12 or more on jeeps and 15 or more on Trekkers & Sprinters.
