- Minjungbal Museum & Cultural Centre

For a unique insight into Aboriginal culture, you can't miss Minjungbal Aboriginal Cultural Centre. It's perfect for those looking to learn about local Aboriginal culture. Run by the area's Aboriginal community, it's a popular meeting place for Goori people and other Aboriginal peoples. You'll find museum exhibits, informative videos, Aboriginal art, and you may even be lucky to see traditional dance and song on the outdoor performance area. Aboriginal tour guides offer tours through the museum and site, telling you about its relics, plants, and animals. Hear how Aboriginal life was when this area was an untouched paradise of natural forest and mangroves, before learning about the cultural significance of Bora Ring, which you can see on Walk on Water walking track.

- Forestry Corporation New South Wales active harvesting site - where FCNSW personnel will be on hand to talk about how they manage their forests. This stand will be blackbutt (*E. pullularis*)- one of the more valuable durable timbers.

- David Fleay Wildlife Center

David Fleay Wildlife Park is Queensland's most natural wildlife park, featuring an amazing collection of Queensland's threatened animals. It is the only wildlife park on the Gold Coast where visitors can see Australia's elusive platypus and the Bridled nailtail wallaby thought to be extinct for over 30 years! Nestled in right in the heart of the Gold Coast the enclosed fauna reserve offers 7.5 acres of parkland with a network of boardwalks inviting visitors to stroll around exploring the diverse array of habitats and unique wildlife within. While just outside you have the opportunity to walk along the Tallebudgera Creek Mangrove boardwalk that is also part of the larger conservation park, all part of Dr David Fleay's legacies. The program of daily wildlife presentations is an ideal way to learn about Queensland's unique native mammals, birds and reptiles. Explore the park on your own or join one of our daily Ranger guided walks to hear first-hand the amazing history, features and skills of Queensland's unique native wildlife.
