What We are Looking for?

TWO Graduate Research Assistantship (GRA) positions at PhD level are available at the Department of Forest, Rangeland and Fire Sciences, College of Natural Resources, University of Idaho

Successful candidate will be involved in a USDA funded project that aims to improve durability and fire resistance of wood products. This is a highly interdisciplinary research project and successful candidates at the PhD level are expected to hold a Bachelor and Master's degree related to the proposed topics of the study, preferably in wood science/products, agricultural/biological engineering, chemical engineering, materials science & engineering, chemistry, or closely related disciplines. The target starting date is in the **Spring semester 2023**.

What We Will Provide?

We will support funding, which will include graduate student's stipend, tuition, and health insurance for three years.
